Volunteer Fairfax helps to build a stronger community through service. As a respected leader of local volunteerism for more than 32 years, Volunteer Fairfax connects individuals, youth, seniors, families and corporations to opportunities at more than 700 organizations in the Fairfax County area.

## 2006: A Year for Milestones

With strong support throughout the community, Volunteer Fairfax continues its upward path to be the central resource for Northern Virginia area nonprofits and volunteers. Highlights include:

- In just 48 hours, recruiting 200 volunteers to help clean up after the Huntington Floods in June. The Center worked with Fairfax County agencies to help families recover.
- Creating a new partnership with Clear Channel Radio to promote volunteerism in the metro area on its Sunday morning public service show, which airs three times a month.
- Administering the Corporate Community Relations Council of Northern Virginia, a membership association for the local business community engaged in volunteering.
- Coordinating projects with Deloitte's "Impact Day," a firm-wide day of service that mobilized 1,300 volunteers in the metro area.
- Strengthening the Center's partnership with the Fairfax County CASH

(Creating Assets, Savings and Hope) program of the Fairfax County Office of Partnerships through a Points of Light Foundation grant funded by Capital One. Volunteers hope to surpass their 2006 success of returning \$1 million to low-income Fairfax County residents.

- Continuing to deliver excellence in flexible volunteering, including the Volunteers for Change program for evening and weekend volunteers.

Any agency in a growth phase such as Volunteer Fairfax must address the demands of expanding programs while balancing the capacity of staff. In 2006, the Center added two full-time staff. The agency also strengthened its internal management practices, adding new personnel policies that offer paid leave for volunteering and a whistleblower policy.

We hope you will continue to make a difference through volunteering, and to encourage those around you – co-workers, family and friends – to serve, as well. Thank you for all that you do to help make Fairfax County a better place to live, work and give!

## Community Impact

**\$907,424** in volunteer hours donated to the community through Center programs (per the Virginia Employment Commission).

**47,000** hours of service over 12 years of VolunteerFest®, which mobilized **850** volunteers in 2006.

**8,000** students learned about generosity at "A Celebration of Giving and Sharing," with the help of **1,600** volunteers since 2003.

**1,300** individuals / groups honored through 14 years of the Fairfax County Volunteer Service Awards.

**900** volunteers placed in 2006 through Alternative Community Service, which has worked with **7,200** clients since 1998.

**650** students participated in youth outreach and high school leadership programs in 2006.

**440** interns hired by local nonprofits through 8 years of the ExxonMobil Community Summer Jobs Program.

**750** participants trained at **40** sessions on volunteer management and emergency response in the last four years.

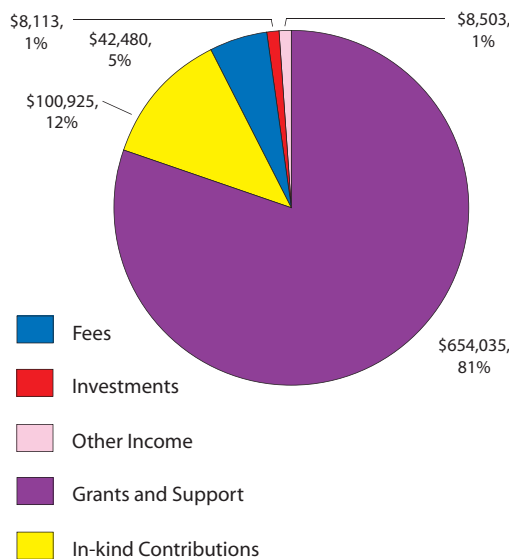

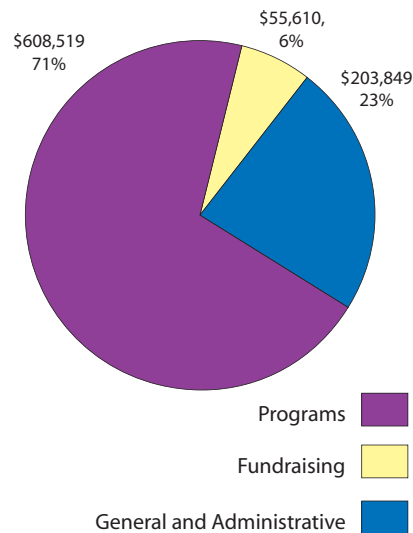
