## WHAT WE DID:

Carefirst team members worked together to assemble and install 10 new shelving units to aid in the expansion of United Community's food pantry This increased space for the food pantry to spread out their food products and allow individuals using the services to feel like they are shopping for the food they need.

Because of the work that Carefirst did, United Community has the shelving to support and display all the food coming in. This allows families to get an authentic shopping experience which ultimately leads to less food waste. The United Community food pantry was closed during the pandemic to protect staff and the community from the virus. Thanks to the help of community members and volunteers like CareFirst, we are now able to open our doors for people to come in and pick and choose which products they would like to take home. United Community serves the historically most impoverished area of Fairfax County. 85% percent of their clients live in the two zip codes with the highest rates of poverty, 22306 and 22309.
